Be it ordained by the Board of Commissioners of Clay County that the following inspection fees are hereby approved, adopted and imposed for each occupancy of "Volume V - Fire Prevention" of the north Carolina State Building Code (1991 Edition). Except for fees posted under N.C. Fire Code reference in which inspector will make the decision in which fee to use.

Minutes of October 3, 1994 Clay County Commissioner's Meeting

The regularly scheduled October 1994 Board Meeting was held at 9:00 o'clock a.m. and those in attendance were Paul Jordan and Robert Scroggs. Howard Walker was absent due to an illness.

The Vice-Chairman, Paul Jordan, brought the meeting to order and upon motion by Mr. Jordan and seconded by Mr. Scroggs the July, August and September minutes were unanimously approved.

Velma Moore appeared before the Board to address her concerns with the Carolina Care Center and also her concerns with the future of Clay County and in particular the Town of Hayesville.

The next item of business was the presentation of a proposed Fire Prevention Ordinance by Donald Weaver, the Fire Marshall. Mr. Weaver went over various aspects of the Fire Prevention Ordinance upon this the first reading of the Ordinance. A copy of the entire Ordinance is attached hereto and by reference thereto incorporated herein.

The next item of business concerned the Audit Contracts for the November 30, 1994 audit upon motion by Mr. Jordan and seconded by Mr. Scroggs it was unanimously approved to award the audit to Shelly Norton Livingston for the fee of \$150.00.

The next item of business was the presentation of an proposed Audit Contract by Shelly Norton Livingston for the 1994-1995 County Audit at a price of \$9,600.00. Upon motion by Mr. Jordan and seconded by Mr. Scroggs it was unanimously approved.

Rehnaye Gibson Talley next presented the Commissioners with Tax Releases in the total sum of \$1,341.15. Upon motion by Mr. Jordan and seconded by Mr. Scroggs the Releases were unanimously approved.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned at 9:50 a.m.
